A *Life* Poured Out in Love

Looking back from the summer of 2022 onwards, I marvel at how it was all possible. *"He gives power to the faint, and He increases strength to him who has no might"* (Isaiah 40:29). Through countless days and nights, weekdays and weekends, without rest, we labored to serve in retreats, camps, conferences, and the sacred work of the School of Nazareth and Amoris Christi programs. The challenges were immense—staff salaries, rent, utilities, meals—but the grace was still plentiful.

We served over 33,000 meals, all without a chef on payroll. Through the work-study program, our team maintained the conference center and landscaped five acres of land. Together, we set up the campus, cooked, served, and cleaned for summer camps and retreats, partnering with Catholic and Christian ministries. These efforts covered a significant portion of our annual operating costs. Yet, there were moments when the weight of a \$25K deficit per School of Nazareth student or other pressing needs brought us to our knees. In those times, our beloved friends and beneficiaries extended their generous hands, embodying the love of Christ.

Was it all worth it? Couldn't there have been an easier way to fulfill the mission entrusted to us? These questions arise but fade when I witness the transformation of hearts and lives. Sitting in formation meetings or serving in silent retreats, I see students growing in character, leadership, and faith. Like Peter, seeing the abundance of fish, I repent in awe: *"Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord"* (Luke 5:8).

This mission—God's mission—is one of obedience, humility, sacrifice, and service. It is a call to gratitude, marveling at how He *"guards us as the apple of His eye"* (Psalm 17:8). He hides us in the shadow of His wings and tenderly leads us to the heights by the prompting of the Holy Spirit. The love and generosity of our community and the guidance of bishops, pastors, and spiritual directors sustain us.

Recently, I asked a School of Nazareth student what he desired most. His answer filled me with hope: "I desire to give Him everything—my future, career, vocation, and my whole life. I want to serve Him and live for His glory in my humanity." In his response, I heard the echo of Christ's call to each of us: to believe, to hope, to love, and to follow Him.

As we look ahead, we join hands with our staff, volunteers, and supporters, united in one purpose: to pour out our lives for His mission. *"Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me... Then I said, 'See, I have come to do Your will, O God'"* (Hebrews 10:5-7).

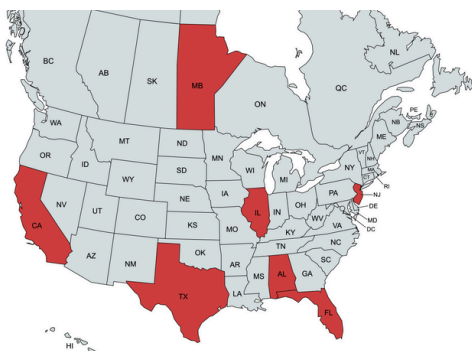
SCHOOL OF NAZARETH

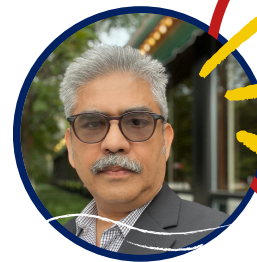

PROPAEDEUTIC FORMATION PROGRAM



In 2016, the Vatican mandated all dioceses worldwide to provide a propaedeutic stage to their programs of priestly formation. This stage is meant to be a pre-seminary experience which offers “a prolonged period of vocational discernment, of growth in the spiritual life and community life” (Ratio Fundamentalis, fn. 93). The principal objective of this stage being “to provide a solid basis for the spiritual life and to nurture a greater self-awareness for personal growth” (Ratio Fundamentalis, no. 59). In the Diocese of Palm Beach, we are blessed to have Amoris Christi’s School of Nazareth housed within our diocese. We

believe this program is able to meet most of the formation requirements for this stage, with others being supplemented by the diocese. In the past three years, we have had six men participate in this program. Most have reported benefiting greatly from School of Nazareth by preparing them for seminary and priestly formation, or helping them make the decision to follow a different path in life. We look forward to continuing this partnership with Amoris Christi for years to come, and see the fruits it’ll bear in our diocese, for those discerning the priesthood and for all in general.

The InSpirit Podcast is an initiative of Amoris Christi Media. It is a long-format bi-weekly podcast that seeks to discover our calling to engage the world.

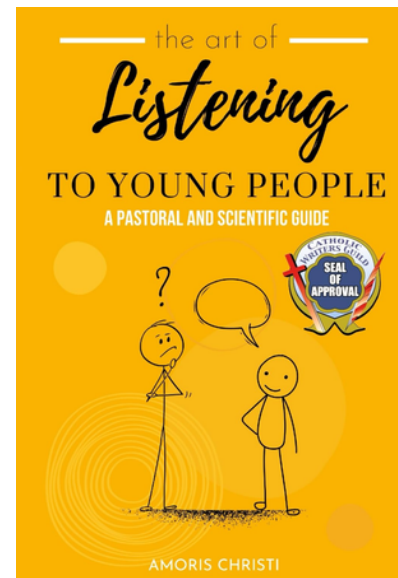




Books

In August 2023, the Institute for Excellence released its first book, *The Art of Listening to Young People – A Pastoral and Scientific Guide*, published by En Route Publications. This work is the result of a collaborative effort involving experts in philosophy, theology, psychology, neurobiology, and medicine, who, alongside insights from over 200 surveyed young people, explored the essential role of listening in pastoral care.

The book has received notable endorsements from Christophe Cardinal Pierre (Apostolic Nuncio to the U.S.), Monsignor James P. Shea (President, University of Mary), and Bishop Joy Alappatt (St. Thomas Syro-Malabar Eparchy of Chicago). Additionally, Bishop David Touns (Diocese of Beaumont) contributed the foreword. Recognized for its impact, the book was awarded the Catholic Writers Guild Seal of Approval and received an Honorable Mention at the Catholic Media Awards 2024 in the Youth and Young Adult Ministry category.

In September 2024, "Listening—An Antidote to the Epidemic of Loneliness," Dr. Anthony Kunnumpurath, MD presented at the Catholic Medical Association Annual Education Conference in Orlando, Florida. The session utilized core concepts from the Institute for Excellence study on listening and was presented as a breakout during the conference. The Institute for Excellence authored its first academic paper — "Aretaic Friendship - A Multidisciplinary Enquiry" and was published as a theoretical essay in the *Journal of Catholic Psychotherapy Association's* academic journal - *Integratus*.

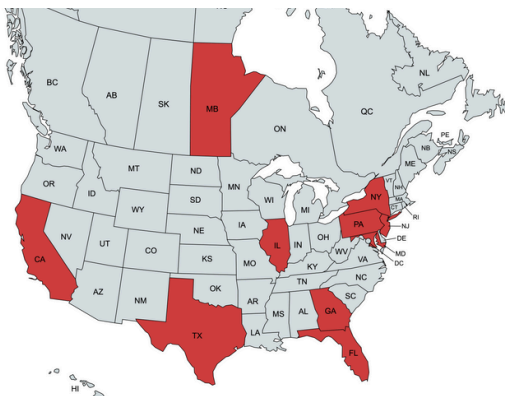
ANointed & SENT

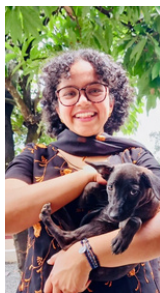

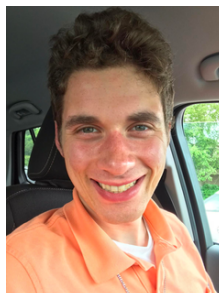

AMORIS CHRISTI RETREATS

The experience of making The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola in the 3,5,8 and 30-day retreat format can be life transforming. Pope Benedict XVI described The Spiritual Exercises as a “strong experience of God, sustained by listening to his Word... which in a climate of silence, prayer and by means of a spiritual guide, offer the capacity of discernment in order to purify the heart, convert one’s life to follow Christ, and fulfill one’s own mission in the Church and the world.”

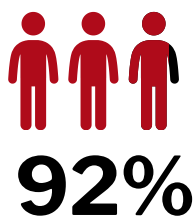

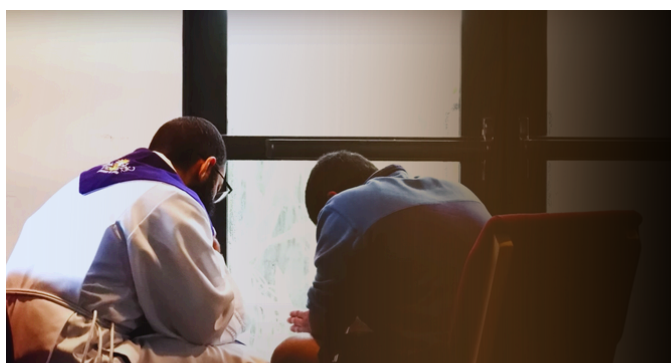

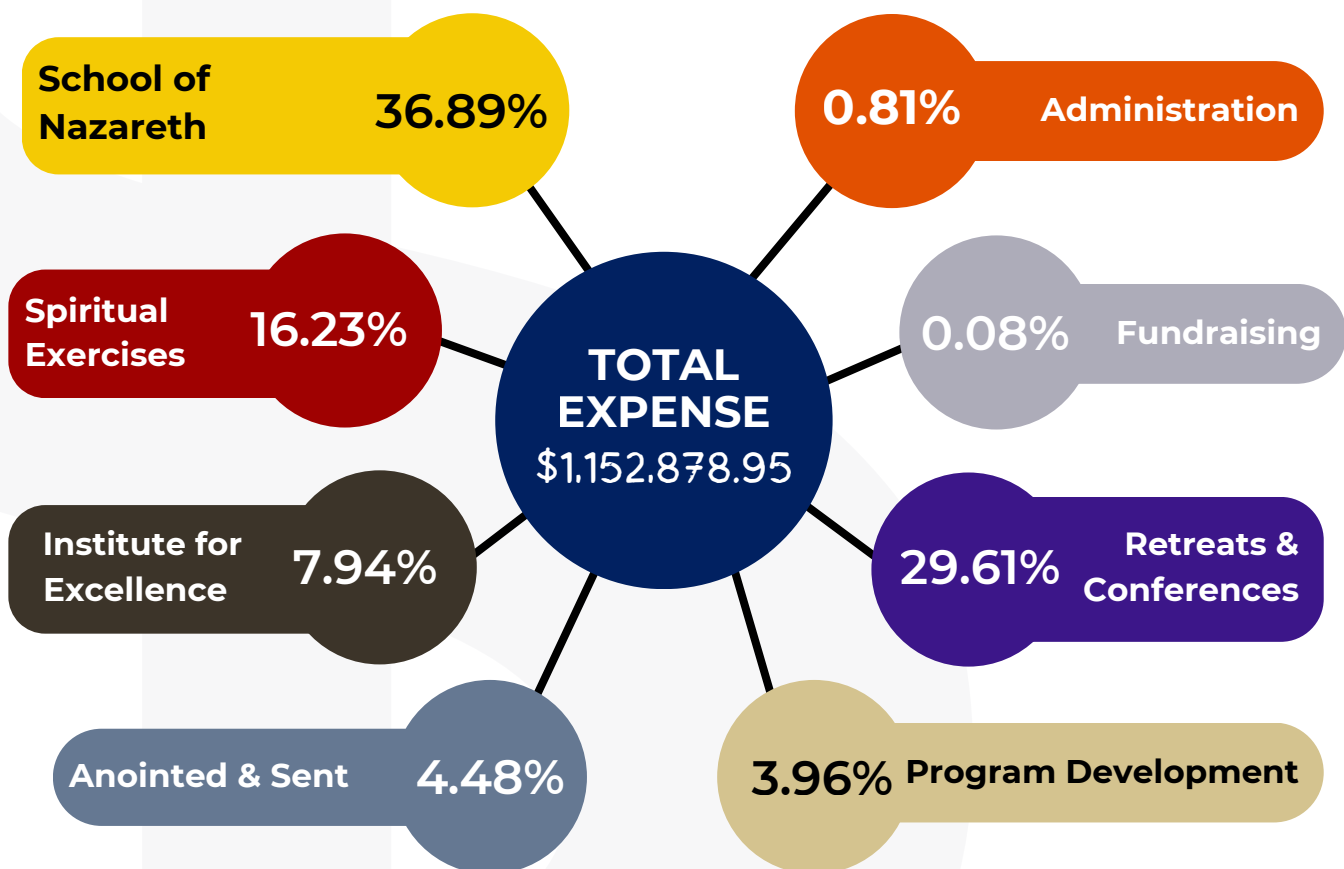

OUTREACH



Flannery Pilgrimage

12 pilgrims including priests and seminarians went on the "Pilgrimage of Grace" to immerse themselves in the life, homes, churches & writings of Flannery O'Connor - a "pivotal" figure in American Catholicism and literature. Visits included her childhood home and Cathedral in Savannah, the archives at Georgia State College and University and Andalusia farm, setting of her stories and final resting place in Milledgeville.

Helping with Parenting Seminar

Our *Helping with Parenting* seminar, held in Houston, Dallas, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, empowers parents to shift from a directive, control-focused approach to a more guiding and supportive style. The goal is to nurture integrated children—balanced in body, mind, and spirit—by fostering meaningful family connections, encouraging quality time, and creating a secure environment built on trust and accountability. Parents will discover how to cultivate freedom and responsibility, transforming the family into a space where children thrive through guidance rather than strict direction.



Confirmation & Catechists Retreat

Amoris has been grateful to host high school students from 3 different parishes in the local diocese to help them to encounter Christ and prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation. The catechists from the local Syro-Malabar parish took a day to deepen in prayer and get trained on how to better 'listen to young people,' based on our ACIE research. The day included stories, sharing and practical tips to empower the teachers. We have also conducted these catechist seminars in the Los Angeles and San Francisco Syro-Malabar parishes.

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LOCAL MISSIONS



Taizé Weekend

Friends and families from local faith communities and parishes were invited for a weekend with Taizé called "Together, Opening Paths of Hope". Brother Emile from Taizé shared about the spirituality of Taizé and many stories of Brother Roger and the community's life and also led Taizé prayer 3 times a day. Participants of different ages shared meals, experiences and learned about various topics from poetry to perseverance to hope. Bishop Dumas of Anse-au-Veaux Haiti also joined for one of the evening prayers.

Old Age Home

Many residents of the local nursing home experience feelings of isolation and abandonment. To help bring joy and foster connection, we participate in monthly family nights and organize an annual Christmas caroling event with local children. Each event, whether big or small, brings warmth and happiness to the lives of the elderly.

Lantana Mission

A group of School of Nazareth students and staff participate in a Jesus Youth tutoring mission in Lantana, FL every Tuesday during the academic year. They assist over 20 children in improving their communication, artistic skills, math abilities, and other life skills. Through this ongoing local mission, the SoNs build friendships with the kids and gradually share the faith with them. The kids come back each week excited to see the SoNs and other volunteers to learn something new or play a game together.



Belle Glades

School of Nazareth student's and staff served the St. Philip Benizi Catholic Church in Belle Glade, FL over the course of the year through a one-day outreach program involving activities and talks for the kids at the parish; a week-long mission trip – visiting families, teaching CCD, and helping around the church; and a weekend confirmation retreat for the kids from the parish here at Amoris Christi. Through these experiences we were able to share the Gospel with hundreds of the youth and parents from St. Philip Benizi and develop friendships that will carry into future years.
